Bardo is a Tibetan word that means "in between state of experience," such as in between birth and death, in between death and the next life, and so forth. When we understand the bardos, we can begin to seek out the means for finding happiness for ourselves and others, now and in the future, and we can arrive at profound insights. This teaching will not only describe these, but also the way to practice through all states of experience, including the process of dying. The six bardos are the bardo of this life, the bardo of dreams, the bardo of meditation, the bardo of death and dying, the bardo of true nature, and the bardo of becoming. You are welcome to come and listen to this teaching with KhentruL Rinpoche who will provide us with a clear understanding of these bardos.
